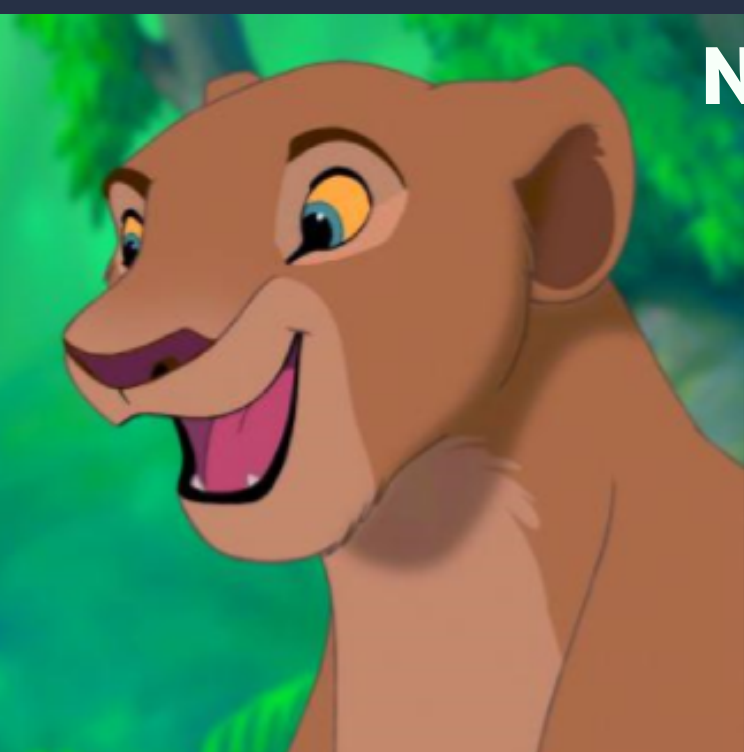

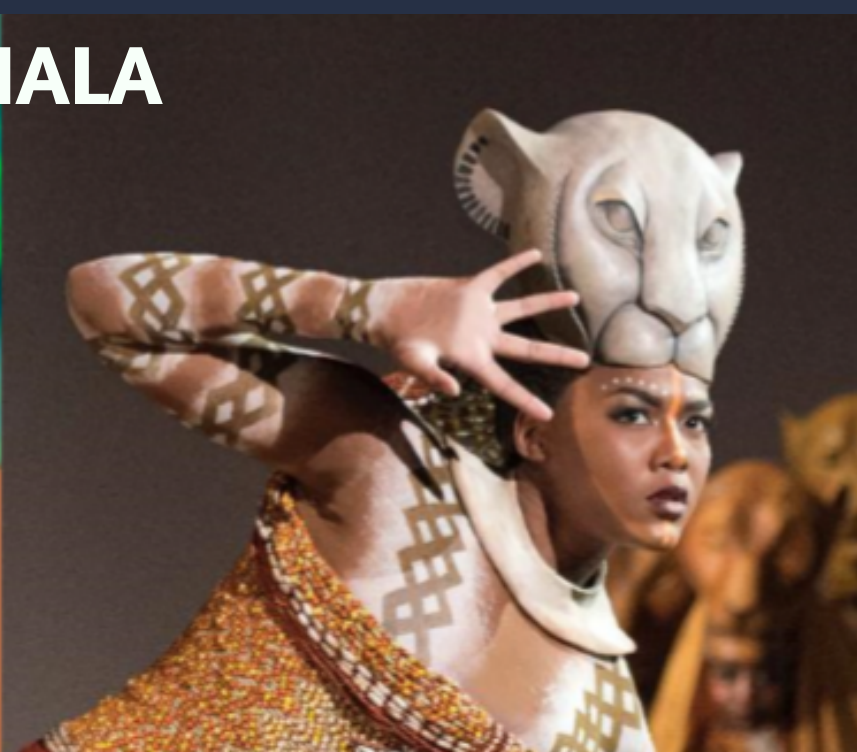
SIMBA
