**DANCE, PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT,
MUSIC, MOVEMENT, ART, COMMUNITY**

SERVING PARTICIPANTS AGES 11 - 80+

STG VIRTUAL AILEYCAMP

5TH YEAR

- Free personal development + dance classes for middle school youth
- **NEW:** hosted via Zoom, art supplies and dance attire delivered to homes, computers and hotspots provided

SONGWRITERS LAB (REMIX)

11TH YEAR

- Young songwriters received mentorship from 5 professional musicians
- **NEW:** hosted via Zoom in 10 ninety-minute sessions, featured guest speakers from outside the state

BROADWAY INCLUSION PROGRAM

2ND YEAR

- Free livestreamed theatre arts classes for neurodivergent and/or disabled community members and their families and caregivers
- **NEW:** hosted via Zoom, prerecorded classes for registrants to take at any time, greater participation resulted due to accessibility

DANCE FOR PD[®]

12TH YEAR

- Free dance classes for people with Parkinson's disease and their care partners
- **NEW:** hosted via Zoom instead of at 7 regional community centers

- 6-week dance training series offering youth 25 different classes and health & wellness resources
- **NEW:** Intensive & Camp combined via Zoom and prerecorded classes, past performance compilation with a free digital cross-cultural workshop

5TH YEAR

- Redefining historic cultural space to elevate underrepresented artists and address issues of inequity
- **NEW:** commissioned local artists Tariqa Waters and A.O. Hamer to design murals over the external windows of The Paramount Theatre

HISTORIC THEATRE MAINTENANCE & USAGE

- Addressing theatre access concerns with the addition of an ADA restroom at The Neptune Theatre and reconfigured seats in all 3 theatres
- **NEW:** all 3 theatres served as pop-up blood donation sites for Bloodworks Northwest

PROGRAMMING & ADVOCACY

- Packing the 2021 calendar with rescheduled and new performances to ensure STG's venues are busier than ever when it's safe to reopen
- Advocating for the health of Washington State's arts sector by supporting ArtsFund, Seattle Artists Relief Fund, NIVA, the RESTART Act, and the Save Our Stages Act
